## Erotics of Power, Resistance and the Limits of Freedom as Negation

Nazia Amin (BML Munjal University, India)

By offering her reflections on a short story dramatizing a scene of street resistance in a specific political context, Nazia Amin attempts to discuss the erotics of power and resistance as well as the limits of freedom as negation.

The question that animates this reflection is:

Might resistance contain an ambivalence within it such that it perpetuates the very forces it seeks to dismantle? What would it mean to think about freedom beyond negation?



Nazia Amin is an Assistant Professor at the School of Liberal Studies, BML Munjal University. She is pursuing her PhD at the School of Humanities and Social Sciences, IIT Delhi. Her research focuses on the questions of freedom, resistance and community in Kashmir. She is interested in learning to think at the intersection of the psychic, the political and the literary. Nazia has taught Psychology at Higher Secondary Schools and she was a Teaching Assistant at IIT Delhi.
