In 21st Century Freud, scholars from across the humanities and social sciences assess the direction they see Freudian theory moving in within their respective fields and strategize about how the discourse must be modified if it is to prove a useful instrument in the years to come.

The first panel, 'Psychoanalysis between Literature and Science', will focus on the epistemological status of analysis. Kevin Reside will defend the concept of the unconscious as a useful theoretical tool through the mobilization of American pragmatism, and the British moral philosopher Anna Hartigan will draw out the ethical implications of psychoanalysis as either a scientific discourse or a literary one.

The second panel, 'Freud and the Political', will see the political theorist Yannis Stavrakakis discuss the relevance of Freudian group psychology to leftist populism, and the Spanish politician and theorist Clara Serra will demonstrate how the Freudian unconscious complicates and deepens current debates on sexual consent.
